Finding Purpose at Brentwood

William's job at Brentwood has become a source of pride and connection. He has had the opportunity to gain skills in several service and dining related areas. "I help serve drinks, clean up, and set up the kitchen. It keeps me busy," he says with a smile. The role fits

Navigating Challenges

The road to finding this fit wasn't straightforward. Previously, William had been working in a sheltered workshop. When it closed, he began looking for other jobs. He found one he thought he might enjoy at Saint Andrews, but it turned out to be more physically demanding than he realized. Heavy lifting aggravated his back problems, he realized that he needed a job that aligned better with his abilities.

Paladin, an agency that helps individuals find meaningful work and housing, stepped in to help support William's employment goals. Paladin connected William to Brentwood, where he found a job he liked and in an environment he enjoyed. Because of Paladin's housing supports, William met
